Who Should be in this Program

Individuals who enjoy interacting with young children, can follow state laws and regulations connected to childcare, and are patient with children as they develop would be good candidates for this certificate program. The career requires individuals to put children first, ensure safety of all children, and communicate effectively with children, staff, and parents.

Background Check

A background check is not part of this certificate program. Applicants should be advised that childcare centers will conduct a background check prior to hiring someone.
